- Flight Status Notification. - Arrive Early. Anticipate possible slowdowns caused by heavy traffic, weather and busy airport parking lots. Travelers must check in at least thirty minutes prior to departure for domestic flights and one hour prior for international flights, so any additional obstacles will require extra time.
