## **Easy Ideas For A Greener Home-Maintenance Routine**

• Give computers a rest— Save a substantial amount of energy by turning computers off at the end of the day instead of leaving them on overnight or defaulting to "sleep" mode. A shutdown computer will save valuable energy and money; according to ENERGY STAR, a program of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, shutting down can save consumers approximately \$90 a year.

• Cut back on the mail— Save a tree by reducing your junk mail intake. Register with the Direct Marketing Association's Mail Preference Service at www.dmachoice.org to see a significant reduction in junk mail within a few months.

• Know your  $H_2O$ —Reduce home water usage by purchasing a water-efficient showerhead. With low-flow models, a family of four can cut water usage by as much as 280 gallons a month and still not feel much difference in water pressure. For added savings, keep showers under 10 minutes per person.
