ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE FACTS AND FIGURES



THESE ARE THE FACTS ABOUT THE ALZHEIMER'S CRISIS.

More than five million Americans are living with Alzheimer's. By 2050, this number could rise as high as sixteen million. Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States. It kills more than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined. Every sixty-six seconds, someone in the United States develops the disease. About one in three seniors dies with Alzheimer's or another dementia.

More than fifteen million Americans provide unpaid care for people with Alzheimer's or other dementias. In 2016, these caregivers provided an estimated eighteen-point-two billion hours of care valued at over two-hundred billion dollars. In 2017, Alzheimer's and other dementias will cost the nation two hundred fifty-nine billion dollars. By 2050, these costs could rise as high as one-point-one trillion dollars.
