

## **Fall Driving Tips**

- Be especially careful on roads where leaves accumulate, particularly following rain, frost or snow.
- Be careful not to park where leaves collect. Wet leaves can be slippery, but dry leaves beneath your car can be ignited by heat from the exhaust system.
- Budget extra time if you'll be traveling on leaf-covered roads, and be patient with motorists driving cautiously.
- Watch for accumulated leaves, which can hide potholes and other uneven surfaces.
- Be conscientious—if your trees line roads, keep driving surfaces clear.
