Get Rid Of Poison Ivy Fast

(NAPS)—Poison ivy, poison oak and poison sumac—they're the kinds of weed you don't want anywhere around your kids or pets. The weeds contain an oil called urushiol that can cause an itchy red rash with bumps or blisters. The symptoms can develop within hours after exposure and last up to three weeks.

You can get the oil on your skin by:

- Touching the poison ivy plant or any clothing or shoes that have come in contact with the plant;
- Touching any pets or gardening tools that might have urushiol on them;
- Burning poison ivy. The oil from the plant is carried in the smoke and can cause lung irritation.

Identification is the key to avoiding exposure. The old saying "Leaves of three, let it be!" is a helpful reminder for identifying poison ivy and oak, but not poison sumac, which usually has clusters of seven to 13 leaves.

The Food and Drug Administration says poison ivy, oak and sumac are most dangerous in the spring and summer, when there is plenty of sap, the urushiol content is high and the plants are easily bruised.

"But the danger doesn't disappear over the winter," says Bayer Advanced garden expert Lance Walhert, author of "Lawn Care for Dummies." "Dormant plants can still cause reactions."

The systemic herbicide enters weeds through their leaves or roots and then moves through the plant. You'll see wilting and yellowing in one to six weeks. Always read and follow label directions.

The American Academy of Dermatology suggests you wear long pants and long sleeves, gloves and boots whenever you're going to be around poison ivy. The American Academy of Family Physicians says if a rash starts to develop, there are several over-the-counter medications you can use to relieve the itching, including hydrocortisone creams, calamine lotion, antihistamine tablets and even oatmeal baths.

Expert Tips To Remove Germs Lurking In Your Kitchen



(NAPSA)—Your kitchen may look clean, but according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, many infectious germs may be lurking around. “Neglecting to clean kitchen appliances is not only unhygienic, it’s unhealthy” says Healthy Housekeeper® Laura Dellutri, author of “Speed Cleaning 101” (Meredith Books, 2005) and “The Overworked Mom’s Stress Free Homekeeping” (Morrow Publishing Inc, 2008). “A regular cleaning schedule helps protect your kitchen from lurking grime that can cause odors and harbor disease.”

Dellutri’s tips for helping maintain a healthy kitchen include:

- **Suspect Kitchen Sinks:** Disinfect the sink after washing meats, fruits and vegetables to help prevent bacteria from multiplying, and avoid cross contamination. All you need is chlorine bleach, water and a soft cloth. Dilute the bleach with water and wipe the sink with cloth dipped in the solution. Rinse and wipe dry with a soft cloth.
- **Disease-Ridden Disposers:** Without proper cleansing, garbage disposers can create odors and house organisms that may cause illness and disease such as pneumonia, bronchitis and intestinal flu. Instead of simply masking odors with fresh lemons, use Disposer Care plus Bleach Alternative weekly to help fight this problem.
- **Grimy Dishwashers:** Hard water deposits, rust and food may disrupt dishwasher performance and cause odors. To remove residue and odors, Dellutri recommends Dishwasher Magic. The dishwasher cleaner disinfects while it cleans, killing 99.9 percent of E. coli and salmonella.

- **Reeking Refrigerators:** To effectively clean your fridge and free it from odor-causing culprits, completely clear it out and remove any expired foods. Use hot soap water with a germicidal cleaner to remove all food particles and spills. Placing washable refrigerator liners over shelves can help reduce scrubbing when a spill occurs.
- **Spotty Microwaves:** Splatters of food in a microwave may decrease microwave efficiency. Fill a microwave-safe bowl halfway with water, add a tablespoon of vinegar and place it inside the microwave. Run the microwave for five minutes, then wipe down the inside with a clean towel or paper towel. The heated water and vinegar will steam up the microwave walls and make wiping away dried-on food a cinch.

“We all need to get in the habit of not just cleaning visible places such as countertops, sinks and floors but also disinfecting out-of-sight areas like the sink’s garbage disposer and the microwave,” says Dellutri.

Stain-Fighting Secrets



(NAPSA)—Here are five suggestions on how to treat such spills as grape juice, jelly, fruit punch and ketchup, which are likely to occur when youngsters are home from school.

1. Use a general-purpose spotter that is available at the grocery or carpet retailer.



Don't cry over spilled milk or juice or many other kinds of stains. Instead, heed a few hints on keeping carpet clean.

2. Agitate (compress, rub gently or distribute chemical evenly), then blot. Continue blotting until the stain no longer transfers to your cloth or until the stain disappears.
3. If necessary, reapply cleaning chemical evenly, agitate and blot again.
4. Rinse with warm water or flush with a personal extractor such as a carpet-cleaning machine with water-only rinse setting.
5. Dry the spot with a hair dryer or fan.

2. Remove your shoes at the front door.
3. Vacuum at least twice a week.

5. Have your carpets professionally cleaned at least once a year by a qualified specialist.
6. Get water leaks fixed immediately to avoid mold.

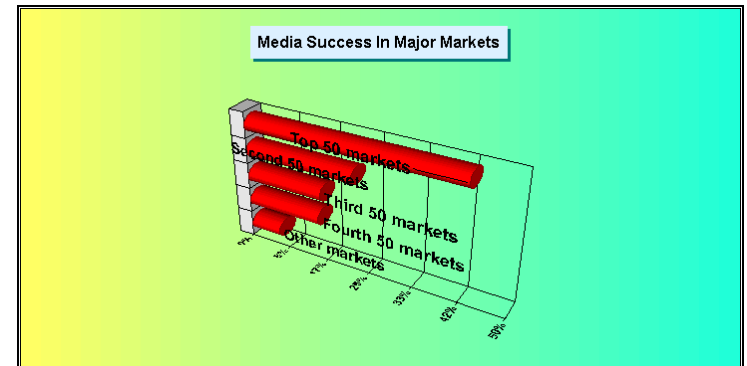
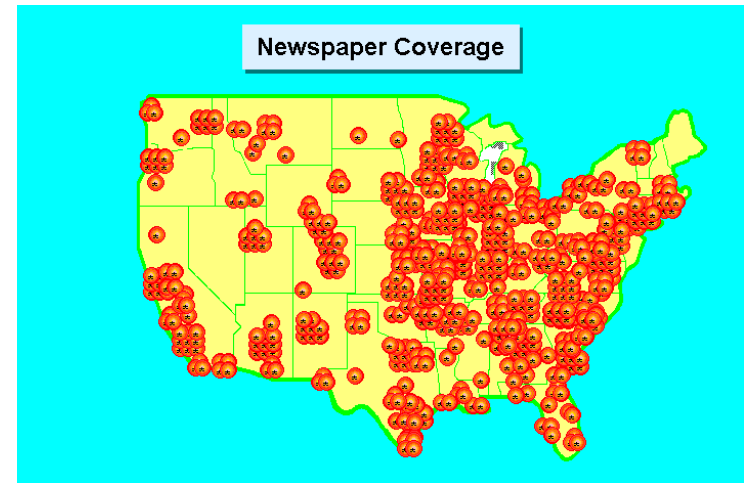

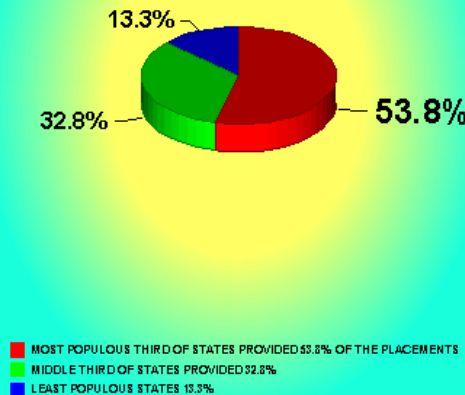
• **Test:** Paint a one-foot square in each color on your wall. Over several days, watch the colors at different times of day, comparing natural sunlight and artificial light.

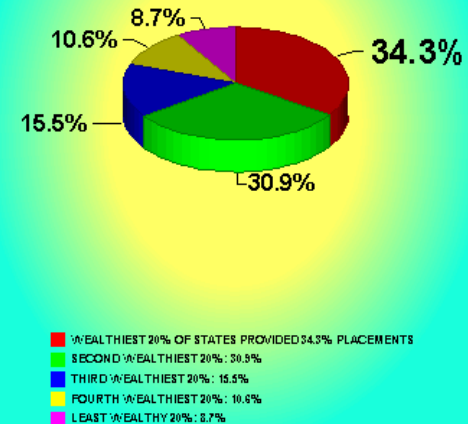

However, if you are a busy family with children that tend to make messes, you may want to opt for a combination of durability and good looks.

A granite slab is the pinnacle of countertop alternatives when it comes to form and function. Prices range from the very expensive to the affordable. More often than not, this little gem will make its way onto your "wants list." Do your homework and you might be surprised to find out that you can afford granite. It may not be that exotic massive slab you have been drooling over, but it might be close. By choosing a more common variety, a thinner cut, a simple edge profile and limiting colors, you will likely spend less than you would on most man-made quartz or solid-surface materials. Remember, despite the fact that your type of granite may be more common, each piece of natural stone is a totally unique piece of art directly from Mother Nature.

If slabs are too costly for your budget, consider granite tiles. Several options exist that vary moderately in price. The highest-end option is a tile that comes pre-assembled with a substantial decorative edge profile. This eliminates any unfinished or awkward-looking exposed edges at the sink rail. The midrange option is a large-format tile (16", 18" or 24" square) with a strip of granite tile incorporated as the sink rail. The most affordable option is the smaller, 12"x12" tile finished with a wood strip to finish off the countertop edge. When choosing tiles, use the larger format in a solid shade with a minimal grout joint and a matching grout color to help give the illusion of a slab.

If your tastes lean more toward a rustic matte-finished countertop material, consider limestone,

travertine, slate or honed marble tiles for your surface. Keep in mind that these materials come with some inherent drawbacks when used for countertops, so research each one carefully prior to committing to it.

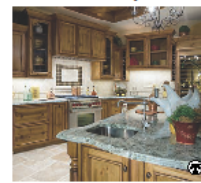
Marble slab countertops, especially white, are gaining in popularity and add a sophisticated, modern look to any kitchen. Some marble, however, is more porous than granite and may etch and stain if it comes into prolonged contact with certain foods. Be sure to ask your stone fabricator for information on marble stone care and upkeep before selecting this material.

While a kitchen remodel on a tight budget might seem like an oxymoron to some, it can become a reality. Remember, granite does not equal cheap, ugly or boring—it can be incredibly beautiful when well executed. Treating the kitchen like any other room of the house by adding features such as unique architectural finds, over-scale accessories, framed art, lamps, plants, fabric and furniture will help exude luxury.
