

## Beautifying The Skin You're In

Using fine crystals suspended in a hydrating cream, the system moisturizes and exfoliates in one step. When applied with the specially designed resurfacing tool, the crystals erase fine lines and reduce the appearance of sun damage and pore size. The gentle formula does no damage to the skin, so there's no recovery time.

To use, women need only apply Sally's I-Skin Crystal Resurfacing cream to cleanse the skin. Then they attach the sponge applicator to the resurfacing tool and use gentle pressure to move the cream over the face. The motion should be continued for up to five minutes, followed by a thorough rinsing with warm water.

The system should be used for five days, then skin should rest for five days. As improvement in skin is seen, the schedule of treatments should be adjusted.

Of course, McCraw advises, you still need to follow the basic rules for good health and good skin: exercise, get plenty of sleep, eat lots of fruits and vegetables and drink at least eight glasses of water a day.

"With smooth, healthy skin as a foundation, your look will really sparkle," he says.
