Increasing the book's potential impact is that it also includes reflections by such world leaders as ex-President Jimmy Carter and former Russian President Mikhail Gorbachev.

It's those and other notables who-with the help of an amazassortment of artwork donated by more than 80 photographers-make the case, for example, against allowing almost 20 percent of the babies born every 24 seconds around the world to grow up with no clean drinking water.
