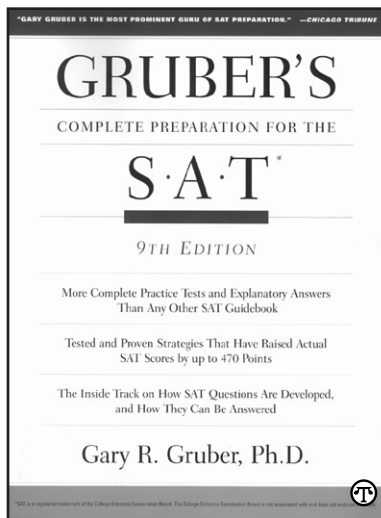

Guide To SAT Focuses On Learning Style

(NAPSA)—Scoring well on standardized tests is a skill that can be learned. That's the message of an author who has been described as the leading expert on standardized tests.



A new book offers strategies that are said to raise a student's SAT score by as much as 470 points.

The method, developed by Dr. Gary Gruber focuses on assessing a student's thinking patterns and providing the mechanisms to improve what he calls critical thinking skills.

In addition to working with individual students, Gruber recently introduced the ninth edition of his book, *Gruber's Complete Preparation for the SAT*, (HarperResource, \$16.95).

In addition to practice tests, the book includes:

- a diagnostic strategy to improve a student's test-taking skills,
- a home study guide,
- the 22 questions found on the SAT that Gruber believes are key for getting into a top school,
- a math skills refresher course and 101 basic questions, and
- a vocabulary builder with 150,000 words.
