

Celebrating Family

With a prologue by *New York Times* bestselling author James McBride (*The Color of Water*), the collection explores what it means to be part of the human family. The book's intimate and exuberant images, embodying wonder and joy, reach across continents and cultures to reveal the heart of humanity.

"The images in this book chronicle what lasts and will always last: A mother's love, a grandpa's pride, a child's giggle, a father's sorrow," said McBride.

Family is the first in a series of three books. Friendship (with a prologue by Maeve Binchy) and Love (with a prologue by Kim Phuc and Anne Bayin) will be published by William Morrow in Sept. 2001.

Each book features 100 of the winning 300 images selected in the worldwide photographic competition, Moments of Intimacy, Laughter and Kinship, or M.I.L.K.
