The school, housed in the watch company service facility, follows the Watchmakers of Switzerland Training and Educational Program (WOSTEP) curriculum, comprising a two-year, 3,000-hour training program. The school is one of five in the U.S. The other schools are Okmulgee, Oklahoma; Lititz, Pennsylvania; Seattle, Washington; and St. Paul, Minnesota.
