(NAPSA)—College and university programs that prepare persons to become special education teachers know how important support is during the years of study. This is particularly true if students are re-entering post-secondary schooling after a period of time or have had educational experiences that were less than optimal.

College and university programs that include support throughout the years of study often provide a learning support center that is staffed by special education teachers, mini-sessions on study skills that support course requirements, small group discussion times for students to share course-related experiences, and help securing financial resources for additional services such as books, transportation, and babysitting.
