In addition, the NRCA found that 88 percent of the employers who responded to the survey offer group health insurance and paid vacations to their employees. Other benefits often include a 40-hour-aweek pay guarantee, retirement plans, vehicle use and more.

The survey also found that a number of roofing companies provide paid training programs that can make it easy for roofing workers to climb the professional ladder.

According to the NRCA, the industry offers employees the opportunity to "stretch their skills" and the potential to advance and "meet their ambitions."
