The new DataTraveler[®] II Plus—Migo[®] Edition USB flash drive gives users the ability to take their desktop with them, so they can use a PC virtually anywhere in the world to access personal e-mail, files and folders, Internet browser settings, favorites, cookies and history.

The preloaded software allows users to store important information so that anyone can work the way they like—on any computer without ever leaving a trace of personal data behind. Upon returning to the home or office, the computer user simply connects the USB drive to the host computer to automatically synchronize content created "on the road."

More Capacity

The drives are available in several capacities. For users who simply want to transport less, a 1GB capacity drive should be fine. For others who need to carry around large data files as well as photographs, music and videos, the Migo Edition is available at up to 8GB.

Whether you're traveling on business or pleasure, bringing your favorite music, photos and work documents just got a lot easier, and you can expect to quickly navigate right through security checkpoints with a lot less stress.
