A Team Web Site Makes Teamwork Easier A New Software System May Help Small Businesses And Others Make Light Work Of Teamwork

All it takes is a Web browser and access to a corporate network or the Internet.

SharePoint Team Services opens the door to seamless communication and efficient collaboration, simplifying a variety of tasks:

- You can set up document libraries, which provide a single location for storing all your team's work. Also, when you assign templates to your document libraries, you guarantee that all documents are consistent and compatible.
- You can interact with your team. Subscriptions and notifications alert everyone to Web site changes. Online document discussion makes it easy to collaborate on specific deliverables without altering original documents. Discussion boards serve as a central forum for specific topics.
- You can manage your team. Once you've launched a Share-Point Team Services-based Web site, a simple e-mail invitation serves to register team members to the site. You can even assign different permission levels to members, depending on their role.

Whether you use your internal corporate network or the services of an Internet service provider, launching and maintaining a Web

site is fast and easy. It takes only three clicks to set up and configure a site running on Microsoft Windows 2000 operating system with Internet Information Services 5.0. SharePoint Team Services lets you delegate administration of the site to a team member, reducing demands on IT staff.

FrontPage 2002 works seamlessly with all Office XP applications—Word, Excel, PowerPoint, etc. For example, users can do the following:

- Save Office XP documents directly into their team Web sites (in document libraries);
- Import Office XP items (e.g., spreadsheets and Outlook contacts) to their SharePoint Team Services lists:
- Export SharePoint Team Services items (e.g., events) to Office XP, including Outlook.

Simple drag-and-drop functionality makes it easy to modify home pages. Also, adding new pages and custom lists is a snap.
