The program, called ExploraVision, is sponsored by Toshiba and administered by the National Science Teachers Association. Since inception, more than 230,000 students have participated in the competition, which is included as part of regular curriculum by many teachers.

Each student on the four first-place teams receives a \$10,000 U.S. Savings Bond while second-place teams receive a \$5,000 U.S. Savings Bond.
