Pamela Lee made it okay to spill out of the front of your bra, but spilling out of the back doesn't have the same effect. When women were asked how they feel about "back fat"—the pinching and puckering that can accompany a "too tight" bra, women said: it shows that a woman doesn't care about her appearance (30 percent), is unstylish (26 percent) and looks trashy (12 percent).
