

Not Your Grandmother's Coupons

(NAPS)—Clip this fact! Over 80 percent of all Americans make purchases using coupons.

With the current economic slowdown, every little bit of savings helps. It always has.

Coupons have been around for more than a hundred years. The very first coupon was issued in 1894 by Asa Candler, the druggist who invented Coca Cola. To get customers to try his soft drink, he gave out hand-written coupons that could be redeemed for a free glass.

Not long after, C.W. Post followed Candler's lead. His coupon offered patrons a penny off any purchase of Grape Nuts cereal. Since then, the coupon has been—and continues to be—money in America's pocket.

New technology and the Internet paved the way for an online "coupon revolution." Today, you can download and print coupons directly from the Web. For example, NestEggz is a new online technology that lets you earn interest on coupon savings.

NestEggz coupons are found on popular Web sites any time of the day, any day of the week (not just Sundays).

just like any coupon.
