Is It A Cold Or Is The Baby Just Teething?

(NAPSA)—Pediatricians and parents have long disagreed on which of a child's symptoms are caused by teething and which symptoms could indicate a serious illness. Happily, researchers have completed a new study to determine

exactly which symptoms can be attributed to teething, and which may have a more serious cause. The study followed 125 babies ages 3 to 6 months for eight months. Here are the results of that study:

• Elevated temperature (up to 102 degrees F), biting, drooling, gum rubbing, irritability, and sucking all were more common among babies who were teething.

• Temperatures above 102 degrees F and diarrhea were not associated with teething, and caregivers should not dismiss these symptoms.
