

## How Technology Can Affect Etiquette

Following are a few helpful hints and etiquette suggestions to better facilitate communication with individuals with hearing loss.

**Get Their Attention First.** Before you begin to converse, get the attention of the individual so he can focus on what you are saying.

Call his name. If there's no response, lightly touch him on the arm or shoulder, or wave your hand.

**Don't Cover Your Mouth.** Keeping your hands or other objects away from your face gives the individual a chance to read your facial expressions and lip movements, which can increase understanding. Also avoid chewing gum or smoking while talking, as your speech may be difficult to understand.

**Speak Clearly...But Don't Shout.** Speaking in a natural tone of voice helps the individual detect clues from inflection, pitch and rhythm. Exaggerated lip movements do not help. Shouting will just confuse the individual and the other people around you.



Be aware of what you say—and how you say it. You may be talking to someone with a hearing impairment and not even know it.

Try rephrasing your sentence if you're asked to repeat yourself.

Make Eye Contact. Face the person when you speak and try to position yourself so your faces are at the same level. Looking directly at the person lets her detect visual cues more easily.
