Umbilical cord blood is a rich and diverse source of newborn stem cells that are collected after a baby is born. Stem cells are an invaluable resource in a variety of medical treatments for cancer and other serious diseases. Newborn stem cells have distinct advantages compared to other sources of stem cells like bone marrow because they are younger, match more easily between family members and are immediately available if needed. They have also demonstrated embryoniclike capabilities to develop into the major cell types in the body.

In addition, doctors are beginning to use an individual's own stem cells (also called "autologous" use) in regenerative medicine to repair damaged tissue and regenerate healthy cells. They are being used to treat diseases that today have no known cure, such as brain injury and type 1 diabetes, and are yielding exciting preliminary results.

Cord Blood Registry (CBR), the largest cord blood bank, is dedicated to helping families preserve
