(NAPSA)—Taking part in the Sister Study can be a great way to honor your sister—and all the women in your life. The study hopes to find the environmental and genetic causes of breast cancer so young women don't have to face this disease.

Women who take part in this study must have a sister who has had breast cancer but never been diagnosed with the disease themselves. The long-term observational study by researchers at the

National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, one of the National Institutes of Health, will collect samples and ask participants questions about diet, jobs, hobbies and things they've been exposed to throughout their lives to determine what may influence breast cancer risk.

Women in the U.S. and Puerto Rico ages 35 to 74 may be eligible to join the study, which seeks 50,000 women of all backgrounds, occupations and ethnic groups. Over 40,000 have already given this gift to their sister.
