- If an ozone generator is used, make sure it's used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

- Be cautious when using ozone in interior spaces. Rubber, plastic or other materials may be oxidized by ozone treatment and possibly release toxic by-products.

- Make sure all employees are appropriately trained.
