## Easy Scratch Repair

(NAPSA)—While the “distressed” look—slightly worn edges, light scratches and missing finish in spots—is popular for furniture and other wood pieces, it may not be the look you’re going for.

Fortunately, it’s easy to fix conspicuous scratches and other minor wood damage.

For light nicks and touch-ups on wood, you can get a Minwax Stain Marker—a marking pen-style dispenser that contains oil-based
