When selecting bath and vanity lighting, the key task is to provide shadow-free lighting on the face while selecting fixtures that coordinate with other accessories in the room. By following these tips, your bathroom can have that individual, yet customized look:

- Add wall brackets to the side of the mirror to further eliminate shadows on the face. For mirrors under 48" wide, use vertically mounted wall brackets.
- Mount one main fixture over the mirror, as well as additional recessed down lights, mounted 24" to 36" on centers between the face and the mirror, to prevent shadows.
- Select lighting fixtures that match the size and scope of a bath. Areas over 100 square feet require several recessed down lights or decorative surface mounted fixtures.
- For large bathrooms or dressing areas, use a close-to-ceiling or small hanging fixture.
- Use high-output shower lights or a ceiling-mounted plastic

unit in the shower for additional safety.

- Consider a recessed unit over the commode as a functional lighting detail.
- Use bulbs with only enough wattage to ensure proper lighting levels. If the fixture uses exposed bulbs, do not use wattage higher than 40 watts. For fixtures with clear or well-diffused glass, use no more than 75 watts. Etched or white glass should be used with no more than 100 watts.
- Use color-corrected fluorescent bulbs with all fluorescent fixtures for a warm lighting effect.
