Cool Ways To Lower Energy Bills

- Install a programmable thermostat you can turn down when you're not home.
- Use compact fluorescent lightbulbs.
- Air dry dishes instead of using your dishwasher's drying cycle.
- Turn off your computer and monitor when not in use.
- Plug home electronics, such as TVs and DVD players, into power strips; turn the power strips off when the equipment is not in use. (TVs and DVDs in standby mode still use several watts of power.)
- Lower the thermostat on your hot water heater to 120°F.
- Take short showers instead of baths.
- Wash only full loads of dishes and clothes.
- Keep your home cooling costs from going through the roof by installing a cool roof that can help reduce energy use. Steel shingles are not only energy efficient, they can reduce roof heat by 100 degrees.

A cool roof reflects and emits the sun's heat back to the sky instead of transferring it to the building below.

Benefits of a cool roof can include:

- Improved occupant comfort
- A possible tax savings.

If your roof tiles are Energy Star-qualified by the U.S. Department of Energy and the Environmental Protection Agency, you may qualify for tax credits under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. It provides up to \$1,500 in tax credits for installing a qualified energy-efficient roof

before the end of 2010. The tax credit applies only to existing principal residences. Your tax professional can determine if you qualify.

The amount of energy savings, if any, depends on the building's design, location and various other factors.
