First, evaluate the condition of your house. Look for bare wood, metal or masonry surfaces. That's where paint is worn and you need a new coat, or you have other problems such as moisture that a profes-

sional painter should assess for you. Use a cleaning solution to remove dirt on siding. Scrub well

and rinse thoroughly. Prepare your house well if you are repainting it. Some loose paint is obvious, some is hard to

find by just looking at it. • Buy the best paint possible for the exterior of a house. The best paint will withstand the elements better than a cheaper type and in the long run may actually save money. The same goes for

brushes and rollers. • Be sure to paint in the shade on a bright day. Painting in the sun can cause the paint to dry too

fast and blister.

Brush first, then roll. Paint the trim last.
