Get The Style Of Wrought Iron Without The Maintenance

(NAPSA)—There's good news for homeowners who want the look of wrought iron fence, but don't want the cost or the upkeep that's usually involved.

A new fencing system has been created that is said to offer the style of wrought iron without the maintenance, work and worry.

Called EverIron Ornamental Polymer Fence, it's engineered from a polymer called Zyron—a high-performance resin that has a long history of use in exterior automotive and marine applications.

According to the manufacturer, the authentic wrought iron detail in the fencing is manufactured in a way that prevents rust, rot, sagging and discoloration. It's also resilient and designed not to dent or bend like aluminum. The fencing also contains special ultraviolet inhibitors that prevent fading or discoloring. And because the color goes all the way through, surface scratches will not show. Plus, the system is designed to be maintenance-free and comes with a limited lifetime warranty.

The EverIron fence "system" consists of a collection of components that can be assembled easily—perhaps even as a weekend DIY project.

Some say the components—which include mounting kits, post caps, corner posts, gates and special hardware for installing posts on a concrete slab—could add a decorative finish to just about any home.

Currently, the fence is available in 6' lengths. The panels can be easily cut to shorter lengths if

needed. The company's Web site provides an easy-to-use project guide to help consumers determine how much fencing material they will need.

The fence is marketed by a company called GeoMatrix. This company also produces several other maintenance-free products for the home, such as Dimensions Plastic Lattice, PegMaster Plastic Pegboard, and a Universal Privacy Screen. The pegboard can be used both indoors and outdoors. The privacy screen is said to add a touch of both beauty and privacy—as well as hide things such as A/C units or garbage cans.

Consumers should always check with local building codes and obtain the necessary permits for decorative fences. Also, be sure to consult with utilities to make sure you will not dig into underground lines when installing fence posts.
