It requires no paint, stain or water sealant, so it is virtually maintenance free. And it looks better, longer." In three years, says Pruett, a composite deck or railing will pay for itself since the homeowner won't have to spend money on additional materials or repairs to maintain it.

And as the temperatures rise, your feet will stay cool on a composite deck. Composite decking is barefoot friendly with a skid-resistant surface, providing outstand-
