the option to machine or hand wash the garment with WOOLITE Fabric Wash.

•To see if garments are washable, try the cotton swab test. Place the edge of the inner seam or hem on a paper towel. Saturate a cotton swab and press firmly down onto the fabric. If no color has bled onto the paper towel, the garment can be tossed into the washing machine with a gentle fabric wash like WOOLITE.
