

## Warmer Months Call For Colorful Statements

all season: Read the care labels. Many unstructured suits are hand or machine washable in the gentle cycle.

• Neutral classics are sexy and, when paired with bright accent colors, the look proves that you don't have to shout to get noticed. Try a fitted white top with a white, lightweight coat, paired with a loden green skirt. Beige is smart for work and play, especially when coupled with a powder blue little shirt and strappy beige sandals.

• No matter what the trends, a wardrobe is an investment—and it's always in style to pay attention to care labels. If the label says "Dry Clean" but not "Dry Clean Only," you may have the option to wash it in the gentle cycle with Woolite if it has no linings or decorative trim.
