- Get to know the seller. Take time to learn about the seller from reviews and recommendations. If you can't access information about the seller on his or her Web site, feel free to reach out directly to obtain this.
- Review the rules of purchase. Check the seller's policies on returns, damages and refunds. You should only buy if you think the selling policies are clear and fair.
- Ask questions throughout the transaction process. Trust-

worthy sites will always have some means to contact a customer service representative, and questions should be answered in a timely manner.

- Choose a secure password to protect account information. When selecting a password for a Web site, use a unique string of letters and numbers. When your transaction is complete, be sure to log out of the site to ensure your information is cleared.
- Only buy from sites with a secure checkout and payment system. Secure online store pages always begin with "https://" in the URL. These sites are programmed to keep information safe and secure. When in doubt, look for the VeriSign and PayPal logos on the checkout page.
- **Keep a paper trail.** Print and save all receipts in case anything is lost, damaged or does not match the description given by the seller.
- Listen to your intuition. If an offer sounds highly suspicious or too good to be true, it probably is.
