# Survey: Road Trip The Preferred U.S. Vacation

(NAPSA)—According to a recent survey, conducted on Yahoo! Travel, an estimated 56 percent of American families are planning on taking a road trip two or more times this year.

### **Popular Destinations**

Coastal road trips are the most preferred for those living in the East, while Las Vegas remains the destination of choice for West Coasters, although many are making pit stops at state parks along the way. Frequently visited road trip hot spots include: Las Vegas, Yellowstone National Park, Hilton Head, Cape Cod, Disney World and New York City.

#### **Passing The Time**

Listening to music was cited as the number one "distracter factor" by more than 74 percent, with singing along to music coming in second at 41 percent. When all else fails, road games such as Punch Buggy help pass the time. Musically inclined travelers tailor their road trips to follow their favorite bands, including Green Day and the Daye Matthews Band.

## **Road Trip Tips**

Consider these tips when planning your next road trip:

- Be flexible—As more drivers hit the road, conditions can become crowded. Research and print point-to-point driving directions from sites such as Yahoo! Maps (http://maps.yahoo.com). Be sure to also check alternate routes in case of heavy traffic.
- Local weather and traffic patterns are also an important factor. Use the Internet to look up your destination for weather forecasts and information about major interruptions on area freeways.
- Be Safe—Make sure to check all areas and fluids in the car before you start your trip: engine oil, coolant, brake fluid, automatic transmission fluid, power steering fluid, belts and hoses, tires, etc. To schedule maintenance e-mail reminders, visit Yahoo! Autos (http://autos.yahoo.com).
