Prepare Your Home For Termite Invasions

(NAPSA)—Termites are a yearround problem for many homeowners. With termite colonies composed of thousands to millions of termites depending on the colony's age and health, homeowners need to know the necessary steps to take to protect their most valuable asset—their homes.

Nationwide, consumers spend an estimated \$500 million each year for homeowners' insurance. Yet, most insurance policies don't cover the damage and destruction caused by termites.

Nationally, termites cause more than \$2 billion in treatment and repair costs each year. If discovered, their work can significantly lower the value of a structure and literally eat up the equity in a home. It's estimated that more than 2 million dwellings are damaged by termite infestations each year.

Large swarms of winged termites inside and/or around the home are the most obvious sign of termite activity. Swarming occurs when reproductive male and female termites exit the colony and attempt to begin building a new colony.


In addition to swarming termites, other common indicators of a subterranean termite infestation include:

- Mud tubes
- Hollow-sounding woodwork
- Wings found around windows, doors, heating vents or in bathrooms and sinks

Experts recommend these tips to reduce termite infestation:

- Keep firewood stacked away from the structure.
- Keep crawl spaces and basements clear of wood debris and moisture.
- Fix any leaks that can cause moisture to accumulate.
- If adding a room or deck, make sure the wood you select is treated to discourage termites.
- Maintain landscaped areas a few feet away from the foundation of the structure.
- Routinely check in and around the structure for mud tubes, discarded wings and general signs of termite activity.
