

## Finding Pest-Fighting Tips On The Web

The site was launched by National Pest Management Association (NPMA), a trade association representing professional pest management companies in the U.S. and around the world, to answer questions about pest control issues.

Pests are a serious economic problem. It's estimated that termites cause more than \$2.5 billion annually in structural damage to more than 600,000 structures in the U.S. alone.

As many as 25 percent of all house fires may be caused by rodents gnawing on electrical wiring.

Pests such as cockroaches, rodents, and termites can also transmit a host of diseases to humans and animals with effects ranging from minor discomfort to death.

Recent studies by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases and the Johns Hopkins Medical Institute have shown that cockroaches and mice allergens are also a significant contributing factor in the childhood asthma epidemic.

Since ridding your home of these pests is so important, the site offers answers to some commonly asked questions about pests and pest management.

NPMA staff members or a pest management professional. Homeowners can request information on local pest management companies, which are equipped to handle their specific needs as outlined in the detailed profile they submit.

Filling out a profile makes the selection process very convenient for homeowners. Once they fill in the information, companies contact them through the NPMA Web site. Then, selecting which companies to use can be done at the homeowner's discretion. The site also offers tips on how to select a qualified pest management professional.

"The Web site allows people to ask questions in relative anonymity before they make the decision to call their local pest management professional," said Rob Lederer, NPMA's executive vice-president.
