• Ensure that you have an annual inspection conducted by a pest management professional.

• Make sure there are no cracks in the concrete foundation. Termites can squeeze through an opening as small as 1/64th of an inch wide, which is about the thickness of one sheet of paper.

• Don't keep firewood, lumber or other wood products stacked or stored against the foundation or within the crawl space.

• Make sure gutters are functioning properly and keep water away from eaves. All downspouts should drain freely and direct water away from the foundation. Splash blocks under faucets should drain away from the house.

• Be sure that the ground around your foundation slopes away from the structure so water does not pool or flow around the foundation.

If a termite infestation has been established, quick action is key. Contact a local pest management professional (PMP) and ask for Bayer Premise, which kills termites immediately, draining the colony's strength.
