NAR's new program includes:

• Research to help Realtors and policymakers better understand housing concerns in their communities;

• Training and business development to educate Realtors about the importance of counseling consumers about the full range of housing options and to introduce Realtors to business opportunities in affordable housing;

• Coalition building activities

• Advocacy to promote a safe, healthy and affordable housing and viable housing finance options;

• Communication activities to encourage housing interests and policymakers to work together to find effective solutions; and

Housing costs are dividing America into two nations, one of "housing haves"—families that bought property before the price explosion or who can afford high prices—and another of "housing have-nots," who must scale down their expectations and make lifestyle sacrifices to afford adequate shelter.

NAR's new Housing Opportunity Program seeks to reverse that trend by empowering and encouraging the nation's 800,000 Realtors to become aggressive advocates for successful, credible and viable housing opportunity programs in their own communities.
