

Mystery Ruins

(NAPSA)—In the jungle off Costa Maya, on the Caribbean side of Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula, lies the magnificent Mayan ruin, Chichen Itza.

Another unexplained mystery takes place at the Great Pyramid every spring and fall equinox, March 21 and September 21, respectively. Precisely on those two days, light and shadow strike the pyramid in such a way as to produce a shadowy picture of Kulkulkan, the feathered serpent god revered by the Mayans.
