## A Bouquet Of Gardens To Visit And Enjoy

• Biltmore Estate. George Vanderbilt's chateau, America's largest private home, boasts stunning grounds to match. Millions of flowers wind throughout a series of gardens.

• The North Carolina Arboretum. Nestled within the Bent Creek Experimental Forest and surrounded by Pisgah National Forest, this 426-acre arboretum includes a Stream Garden, Quilt Garden and Heritage Garden, which reflects Southern Appalachian culture.

• Daniel Stowe Botanical Garden. Broad expanses and intoxicating scents draw you near this garden created by Geoffrey Rausch. Four distinct gardens, vine-laden pergolas and no fewer than a dozen fountains are nestled among forests and meadows.

• North Carolina Botanical Garden and Coker Arboretum. The arboretum features the state's native plants. There's a shade garden, fern collection, native perennial border with rare plants and an aquatic collection.

• Old Salem. The town of Old Salem was established in 1766 and many of the original gardens have been re-created on their original sites and are planted with the same varieties of vegetables, ornamentals and herbs noted in historic records.

• Reynolda Gardens of Wake Forest University is a four-acre formal garden that features perennials and roses, plus vegetables and fruits in a decorative design.
