- Take a change of clothes for the day's outing and wear comfortable shoes. Many attractions have water rides that will get you wet, but keep you cool. Most theme parks offer lockers for a nominal fee.
- Take a break from the parks in the afternoon to relax by the pool and return at night for excit-

ing shows and events. Get your hand stamped for re-entry when leaving the attraction.

- Consider renting a stroller at the parks to save wear and tear on little feet and adult backs.
- Purchase larger souvenirs on the way out of the parks to avoid having to carry them around all day.
- Try to choose brightly colored T-shirts for every member of the family so you can easily identify yourselves in a crowd.
- Don't forget the video and still cameras to capture all the made-in-Orlando memories.
