The Road to Rome: A Modern Pilgrimage, which runs until May 7, 2003, shows ancient, sacred sites painted by artist and Benedictine monk Father Jerome Tupa. The art exhibit, made possible by Target, depicts shrines throughout the Italian countryside from Milan to Rome.
