Similar to a real baby, the doll really "learns" to use her "potty"—the more girls nurture and care for their baby, the better she gets at "holding it."

Another in this new generation of dolls is Baby Alive Go Bye Bye. With this doll, girls can take their precious little one on-the-go. Everyday "traveling" is made eas-

ier thanks to the colorful, convenient carrier that converts into five different positions including a baby carrier, feeding chair, rocking cradle, front carry pack and tote.

Like a "real" newborn, the Peek-N-Play doll loves to have fun. Girls can simply place the baby's hands over her eyes, press her foot and the baby will "play" peekaboo.
