Tips from the experts at Dremel and Ty Pennington Getting Started

Before you start, make sure you can finish. Consider the magnitude of the project, the cost, timing and your ability to complete the project before you start. An inaccurate estimate can lead to a bigger project. Avoid ending up with a hole in your wall or a table without chairs.

Measuring Tricks "Use a buck in a pinch, it's exactly six inches." If you're stuck without a tape measure to determine the length of your material, use a dollar bill to get a rough estimate because it's six inches long.

"Cut it long and you can't go wrong." It never hurts to cut materials longer than you anticipate because you can always make them shorter, if needed.

"Good advice to measure thrice." The old carpenter's saying is to measure twice and cut once but it's always a good idea to check, check and recheck your work to ensure the accurate length.

Tools to Use

Tools with versatility such as a Dremel Rotary Tool are handy for a variety of tasks.

Use a 6' level as a straight edge to make perfectly straight cut lines. Place the level straight and when cutting, simply follow along the edge.
