The White House In Tune With History A Musical Journey

The one-hour film was produced by the White House Historical Association.



This is a film about America's house—where presidents and first ladies entertain and are entertained. Where Pablo Casals and Duke Ellington were welcomed equally and where the Marine Band has performed since 1801—Presidential history with a difference.

Since the United States Marine Band, known as the "President's Own," performed on New Year's Day 1801, the White House halls have echoed with the sounds of classical, folk, opera, jazz, blues, country and western and rock and roll. *In Tune With History* offers glimpses of black tie evenings, afternoons on the lawn and swinging on the dance floor.
