

Stay Tuned In To What Your Kids Are Watching

- The power to modify— Parents also have the ability to override broadcast ratings and restrict specific channels to decide which programs to allow and hide in KidZone.
- The power to selectively censor—This means parents can lock out all programming or channels that are not specified for Kid-Zone from access by children, while making channels readily available when adults want to watch television.
- The power of a password— The feature is password protected and after four hours of inactivity, the TiVo box will automatically default to KidZone.

This latest service feature provides parents with full and total control of what their kids can and cannot watch.
