Off-Road On Target For More Family Fun

Every member of the family can enjoy a full day of off-roading fun with the help of a line of all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) from Suzuki.

For example, the QuadSport Z400, the company's first fully recreational ATV, features a compact aerodynamic look, plush suspension and a high-performance, four-stroke engine.

The Z400 is aimed at experienced riders. Other sport-oriented models beginners are likely to love include the QuadMaster 50 and QuadSport LT80. These entry-level machines have convenient, user-friendly features including a handy built-in throttle limiter that lets parents control the ATV's speed to accommodate young riders of all skill levels.

For riders wanting sportiness and utility, four Eiger ATVs come with automatic or manual transmissions and two- or four-wheel-drive. Other mid-size ATVs are the new LT-F250 Ozark—a practical but fun choice for riders of most skill levels—and the QuadRunner LT-F250F and LT-F300F King Quad. Both are outfitted with practical features to get the job done, yet sporty enough for joy rides at the end of the day.

Finally, when only a super-sized ATV will do, there's the Vinson LT-A500F 4x4, a "sport-utility" ATV designed for the roughest terrain and most challenging jobs. Equally hard-working is the QuadRunner LT-F500F, great for heavy-duty four-wheeling yet agile and compact enough to fit in a standard-size pick-up truck.

As fun and practical as ATVs are, riders are strongly encouraged to wear a helmet and protective gear, ride only on marked courses and follow posted safety rules at all times.
