(NAPSA)— The trend toward the red, white and blue is complemented by an increasing enthusiasm for all things Americana in decor and accessories.

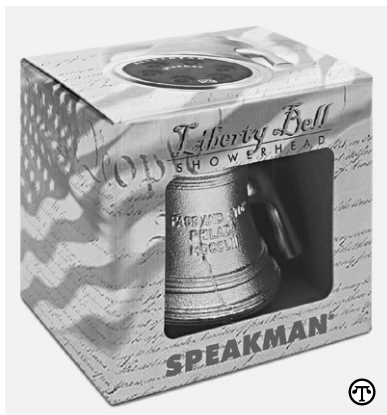
Celebrate liberty and freedom while giving a practical gift. Many people may be glad to get one of a limited edition of Liberty Bell Showerheads.

The Liberty Bell was first hung in Philadelphia's Independence Hall in 1753. It bears the inscription, "Proclaim Liberty throughout all the Land unto all the Inhabitants Thereof" from Leviticus, 25.10 and was rung in July, 1776, to proclaim the Declaration of Independence. Among other historical occasions, it tolled to call together the people of Philadelphia to discuss the Sugar Act in 1764, the Stamp Act of 1765, the first Continental Congress in 1774 and the battles of Lexington and Concord in 1775.

In 1976 the bell was moved to a new pavilion behind Independence Hall and the first edition of Liberty Bell Showerheads was introduced to commemorate the Bicentennial.

"During the period after September 11, I kept thinking of a way to 'wave the flag' and show in some small way the inherent value of being an American and acknowledge the appreciation of living in the United States of America," says Michael J. Santora, Director of the Shower Products Business Unit at Speakman, the manufacturer.

The showerheads are made from solid brass and engineered to last a lifetime. The company's premium showerheads can be found in many prestigious installations including Ritz Carlton, Hilton, Westin and Fairmont Hotels as well as in approximately 20 mil-

lion households and institutions around the world. The fully adjustable Liberty Bell showerhead features a side-adjusting handle to allow the bather to set a desired spray from gentle rain, to invigorating needle, to full flood. The unique six-plunger jet system was engineered to give a strong spray at high or low water pressure installations. The faceplate assembly is made from deposit resisting materials, with no pinholes to clog; just turning the handle will drain the showerhead of internally trapped water. It's equipped with a removable flow regulator designed to deliver only the necessary volume of water regardless of water pressure and to limit the flow to 2.5 gallons per minute maximum.

Each comes with a numbered Limited Edition history and information card. Limited Edition No. 10001, went to President George W. Bush for the White House.
