This accessory marks the first time barbecuers can accurately detect if they are low on propane. Monitoring the device periodically will warn you in advance that the tank is nearing empty so you can pick up

another cylinder.

In addition to monitoring the propane level in the tank, it is a built-in leak detector and emergency shut-off feature. If a propane leak results from a cracked or badly worn hose, or in the event of a fire, the device stops the flow of gas to the grill.
