## Helping Help Find You

(NAPSA)—In an emergency, the only thing more important than knowing what to do is knowing that help knows where to find you.



### **Emergency wireless phone identifies caller's location.**

Research shows that up to half of the 42,000 Americans who die annually in car crashes could be saved if emergency help could reach them sooner.

This life-saving fact is not lost on consumers. A recent Harris Interactive poll found that the number one cell phone feature desired by Americans is the ability to be located in an emergency. Currently, 911 operators can not determine the origin of a wireless call.

There is now a new type of wireless phone called the Magnovox® MobilePAL<sup>+GPS</sup> that can locate callers. It is the country's first emergency wireless phone and service that uses global positioning satellite (GPS) technology to provide caller-location anywhere in the country.

Users press a large, red CALL button—instead of a dial pad—to reach the Personal Assistance Link (PAL) monitoring center. There, a highly trained personal assistant can activate the phone's GPS feature. In seconds, the assistant can pinpoint the caller's location within 30 feet and notify the nearest emergency services (police, ambulance, roadside assistance, etc.). The phone also has a built-in, 95-decibel siren for added security and runs on alkaline batteries that never need recharging.
