Under The Rug

(NAPSA)—Sixty-four percent of U.S. homeowners have rugs in their homes, found a recent survey by the Institute of Inspection, Cleaning and Restoration Certification (IICRC), but only 40 percent clean them on a regular basis. Like carpets, rugs require proper maintenance to retain their appearance and durability. The IICRC recommends the following steps to keep rugs looking great:



When having your rugs cleaned, be sure to use a certified professional who specializes in rugs.

 Know what type of rug you own. Machine made, hand knotted or tufted construction, as well as various fibers used in the rug, affect the method of cleaning.

 Use padding underneath the rug to protect floors, keep the rug

in place and lessen damage.

Blot spilled liquids quickly with a dry, white cloth or paper towel.

 Vacuum rugs regularly frontback-front to remove particle soil.

• Store clean rugs wrapped in paper in a clean, dry location.
