Getting Rid Of Tough Brush, Poison Ivy, Oak and Sumac

(NAPSA)—As many as 50 million people develop an allergic rash each year, according to the American Academy of Dermatology, after coming in contact with poison ivy, poison oak or poison sumac.

"One or another of these nasty weeds grow everywhere except Hawaii, Alaska and some desert areas in the western United States," says Garden Expert Lance Walheim, who wrote the book "Lawn Care for Dummies" and who is a regular contributor to Sunset magazine.

Symptoms

These poison plants contain an oily ingredient called urushiol that causes allergic reactions that include redness, bumps, blisters, itching and swelling. Scratching the rash can introduce bacteria into the open sores and cause a secondary bacterial infection. Severe infections may produce abscesses, enlarged glands and fever.

How You Can Be Exposed

- Direct contact—touching the sap of the toxic plant.
- Indirect contact—touching something on which urushiol is present. The oil can stick to the fur of dogs or cats, to garden tools or sports equipment, or to any objects that have come into contact with it, including mulch.
- Airborne contact—burning poison plants send urushiol particles into the air.

When urushiol gets on the skin, it begins to penetrate in minutes. A reaction appears, usually within 12 to 48 hours. In a few days, the blisters become

crusted and take 10 days or longer to heal.

Treatment

If you think you've had a brush with poison ivy, poison oak or poison sumac, follow these simple steps:

- Wash all exposed areas with soap and cold running water.
- Wash your clothing in a washing machine with detergent.
- Relieve the itching of mild rashes by taking cool showers and applying over-the-counter preparations.
